# TRAILL'S INDIAN DIARY

FOR

## 1901.

(17th Year of issue.)

MAHOMEDAN YEAR.—The "Hijra" signifies "departure" or "separation," and refers to the flight of Mahomed from Mecca to Medina, which is said to have taken place on the night of the 15th July, 622 A.D. The Mahomedan era commenced on 16th July, 622 A.D. The year is a lunar one, and contains an average of 354 days 8 hours 48 minutes.

Fuslee Year.—Or the Harvest Year, from "fasl" signifying crops. This era was introduced by the Emperor Akbar, and time was computed as follows:—The "Samvat" Year commenced 57 B.C. and was in 1555 A.D. 1612 (i.e., 1555 + 57 = 1612). The Hijra Year was then 963, and under Akbar's orders the Samvat Year 1612 was reduced by 649 years, and called the Fuslee Year 963, corresponding to the Hijra Year. Since then the Samvat and Fuslee Years have gone on concurrently. Both are luni-solar years, while the Hijra is a lunar year, consequently, in course of centuries the Hijra Year, which commenced on equal terms with the Fuslee Year in 963, has long passed it now.

It will thus be seen that by adding 57 years to our year we get the Samvat Year; and by deducting 649 years from the Samvat, we get the Fuslee Year. Thus A.D. 1901 + 57 = 1958, the Samvat Year. From 1958, the Samvat Year, deduct 649 years and we have 1309, the Fuslee Year. Another mode of calculation is this: add 649 years to the Fuslee Year, and the result gives the Samvat Year, or add 649 - 57 = 592 to the Fuslee Year, and it gives the Christian Year. There is, however, one material fact to be borne in mind, and that is, if more than four months of the Christian year have expired, the addition to be made to the Fuslee Year will be 593, and not 592, and then the calculation would be:—Fuslee 1309 + 649 = 1958, the Samvat Year, and Fuslee 1309 + 592 = 1901, the Christian Year.

#### THE "FOSTER" WHIST MARKER.

In Rosewood, Ebony, and Ivory. For Short or Long Whist.



This Marker possesses the advantage of having the indicating devices always level with the surface, and equally visible from every position at the table.

The number of points gained is marked by pressing the fingers on the outer edge of an equal number of keys, when White Faces will take the place of the dark ones. The number of White Faces on the Marker will show the state of the score. They can be simultaneously set back again by simply pressing on the table the edge of the Marker under the keys.

Marker under the keys.

In scoring points in a game the large keys are used, the four on one side being reckoned as one each, the single one on the other side as five.

The three small keys are for the number of games or rubber points. In whist, if the vinners are game when the adversaries are nothing, they mark a TREBLE, by turning all three: if the losers have one or two scored, a DOUBLE, by turning up two; if they have three or four scored, a SINGLE, by turning up one.

The Markers may be used for other games, the small keys being reckoned as ten


