

### INDUSTRIAL MOME.

This enterprise, recently inaugurated at No. 359 West Fourth Street, Cincinnati, O., has been carried Torward so quietly that few of our citizens or friends in the Conference realize fully the extent and variety of the work in hand. It is under the auspices of the Woman's Home Missionary Society, and is the special work of the Cincinnati Conference Association.

The property was purchased in April, 1891, and the Home opened in May. The large house proves none too big for the demands of the work. Six missionary workers are busy from morning till night, and four hundred and seventy in the various classes taught by them are aided to better and happier lives by their efforts. The weekly sewing-school averages sixty girls in attendance. A night-school for boys includes a number of bright lads who are in service during the day, and who could neither read nor write when this school was

will include all branches of cooking, the care of food, diningroom service, marketing, laundering, and other departments of housekeeping. It will also include lectures in chemistry, the physiology of digestion, and a course of lessons in sick-room cookery.

Diplomas or Certificates will be given to pupils who complete successfully either course of lessons.

Demonstration lessons and lectures will occasionally be given, announcement of which will be made later.

Afternoon lessons every day from 2 to 5 o'clock, commencing January 18, 1892. Evening lessons from 7 to 9.30 daily, except Saturday, when the hours will be from 9.30 to 12.30 and from 2 to 5 P. M.

At the close of every lesson the food cooked will be served as a lunch.
