My first true drawings were crazy janes. croutched monkey style over my newsprint I scribbled out spiders, mad virgins, and jagged cross-eyed ducks. Abortive attempts to grip my adolescent torments by the soul and snap their kodaks.

In 1967 I met Robert Mapplethorpe. He destroyed the neurotic innocence of my work and instilled in me more penetrating desires. To mix and melt with pure intellect. To struggle within a trapazoid, a trap door, a surreal space with sensuality and finesse. Robert taught me the power of the line long before I was struck like light with the power of the word. I confess I never went leapfrog from drawing to painting. Instead from drawing to heiroglyph to pure word to language. Drawing has become an integral part of my writing. One frozen image before the long slobbering succession of words.

Dubuffet once said a drawing is the true skeleton of art. These drawings are representative of my closet full of graphite skeletons; all jangling with nervous energy and their own peculiar rhythm. To me each drawing has a soul, moving in its own universe only as eternal and spatial as a good sheet of rag paper. Each one a little jewel...a pigeon blood in the rough.
