Seventeen ladies met by invitation of Mrs Wright to consider the subject of organizing a local Political Equality Club. Mrs John Munro was chosen President and Miss Carpenter Secretary pro tem.

The President introduced Miss Mills who set forth the advantages of the organization.

Mrs Jenny followed Miss Mills with suggestions in regard to the organization of such a club.

Remarks were made by Mrs Wright, Miss Carpenter, Miss Chamberlin, Mrs Cook, Mrs Jenny and Mrs Smith.

By request Miss Chamberlin read the printed Constitution and by laws.

On motion of Mrs Wright this Constitution was adopted by
